


Policy on conflict minerals

Following the passage of the "Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act" on 21 July 2010 in the United States, including Section 1502 which governs the disclosure of any use of "Conflict Minerals" and following the publication of Regulation (EU) 2017/821 of 17 May 2017 in the Official Journal of the European Union setting out supply chain due diligence obligations for EU importers importing tin, tantalum and tungsten, their minerals and gold from conflict or high-risk areas, RS ISOLSEC undertakes not to source conflict minerals.

As the purchase of conflict minerals (commonly known as 3TG) and their derivatives, originating from mines in the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) and neighbouring countries, may be used to directly or indirectly finance armed groups engaged in civil wars resulting in human rights violations and serious environmental problems, RS ISOLSEC has requested its suppliers to refuse to import and use conflict minerals in all the equipment they currently supply and will supply in the future. Accordingly, and based on the information made available by its suppliers, RS ISOLSEC declares that the raw materials used in the manufacture of its equipment do not knowingly contain any conflict minerals.
